John is the arranger of many of the duets played with pianist Toney Fenelon. He will present "The Goat", a short Buster Keaton silent movie comedy as part of his concert

JUSTIN STAHL (USA) joins a long list of fine overseas young organists that have launched their careers in Australia. He is a graduate of Marian University with a Bachelor's degree in piano performance. Justin has most recently entertained thousands of patrons of the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra. Enjoy an afternoon of great music from ragtime, pop, Broadway, jazz and film. His latest CD will be available.

DAVID BAILEY (QLD) is organist for the Brisbane Gallery of Modern Art. Besides playing concerts in all Australian States he has a busy annual schedule of accompanying silent films on the Gallery's Wurlitzer organ. With a liking for music from the shows he is a popular performer in Australia. This is David's fifth Karrynup concert and it will include accompanying a silent film with his creative themes and their synchronizing to the action.

8 October 2pm

RAY CLEMENTS and JOHN FUHRMANN will be "Together Again" and share a concert. John Fuhrmann was MGM organist at the Metro Theatre Wurlitzer Organ from 1966 to 1973 and specialises in music from Broadway shows and the roaring twenties. Ray played electronic organ in number of Perth theatres and has played many concerts on the Wurlitzer Organ over the past 25 years. Some piano and organ duets will be performed

KARRINYUP WURLITZER ORGAN

The instrument is the largest theatre organ to have operated in Western Australia. The Wurlitzer is a 3 manual 21 rank organ with 187 stops.


Originally installed in the Regent (later Metro) Theatre, Perth in 1927 as a 2 manual 8 rank organ, with an additional 4 ranks of reeds added a year later, the organ was smaller than the Ambassador's Theatre Wurlitzer but was prolifically broadcast until the late 1940's.

Resident organists who played at the Metro Wurlitzer include Les Waldron, Anthony Northe, Lesley V Harvey, Horace Weber, Stanfield Holliday and John Fuhrmann

When the Metro Theatre was demolished Stirling Theatre Organ Productions purchased the organ and for the last 36 years it has resided in the Karrinyup Community Centre where extensive extensions and restoration work has been undertaken. The organ is peppercorn leased to the City of Stirling.
